WEEK 1

It's always good to be humble. Matthew 7:1–5; John 20:19–31



Take a moment to read the passages we're covering this week. What stands out to you in this passage and why?



Ask God to show you any areas of your life where you need to grow in humility.



So what's next for you? Do you need to humble yourself by admitting when you were wrong? Or by asking someone for help? Or by elevating someone else above yourself? Whatever your next step is right now, take it.

WEEK 2

We can always forgive. Matthew 18:23–35; 1 John 3:1–7



Take a moment to read the passages we're covering this week. What stands out to you in this passage and why?



Ask God to help you identify someone you need to forgive (or someone whose forgiveness you need to ask for).



So what's your next step? Is there someone you need to forgive? Do you need to ask someone for forgiveness? Do you need to set some new boundaries in a relationship where hurt has happened? Whatever your next step is right now, take it.

WEEK 3

Jesus is always fair. Matthew 20:1–16; John 10:11–18



Take a moment to read the passages we're covering this week. What stands out to you in this passage and why?



Take a moment to say thank you that everyone has equal access to God, even when other things in life aren't fair.



So what's your next step? Do you need peace in a situation where life hasn't been fair? Is there an area in your life where you've been unfair to someone else? Is there something you could do to help someone else whose situation isn't fair? Whatever your next step is right now, take it.



Love always needs action. Luke 16:19–31; 1 John 4:7–21



Take a moment to read the passages we're covering this week. What stands out to you in this passage and why?



Ask God to help you identify ways you can love others through your actions.



So what's your next step? Who could you show kindness to this week? Could you buy coffee for a friend or co-worker? Could you spend time with someone who needs to feel God's love? Whatever your next step is right now, take it.
