# How to talk with your kids about tragedy:

1. **Ask** them what they have heard – clarify any misinformation
2. **Encourage** them to share what they think and how they feel
3. **Invite** them to ask questions, be ok with saying “I don’t know”
4. **Discuss** their own safety and protection
5. **Tell** them we live in a broken world where sin and evil are real
6. **Remind** them that God is in control, He redeems and restores
7. **Pray** with them
